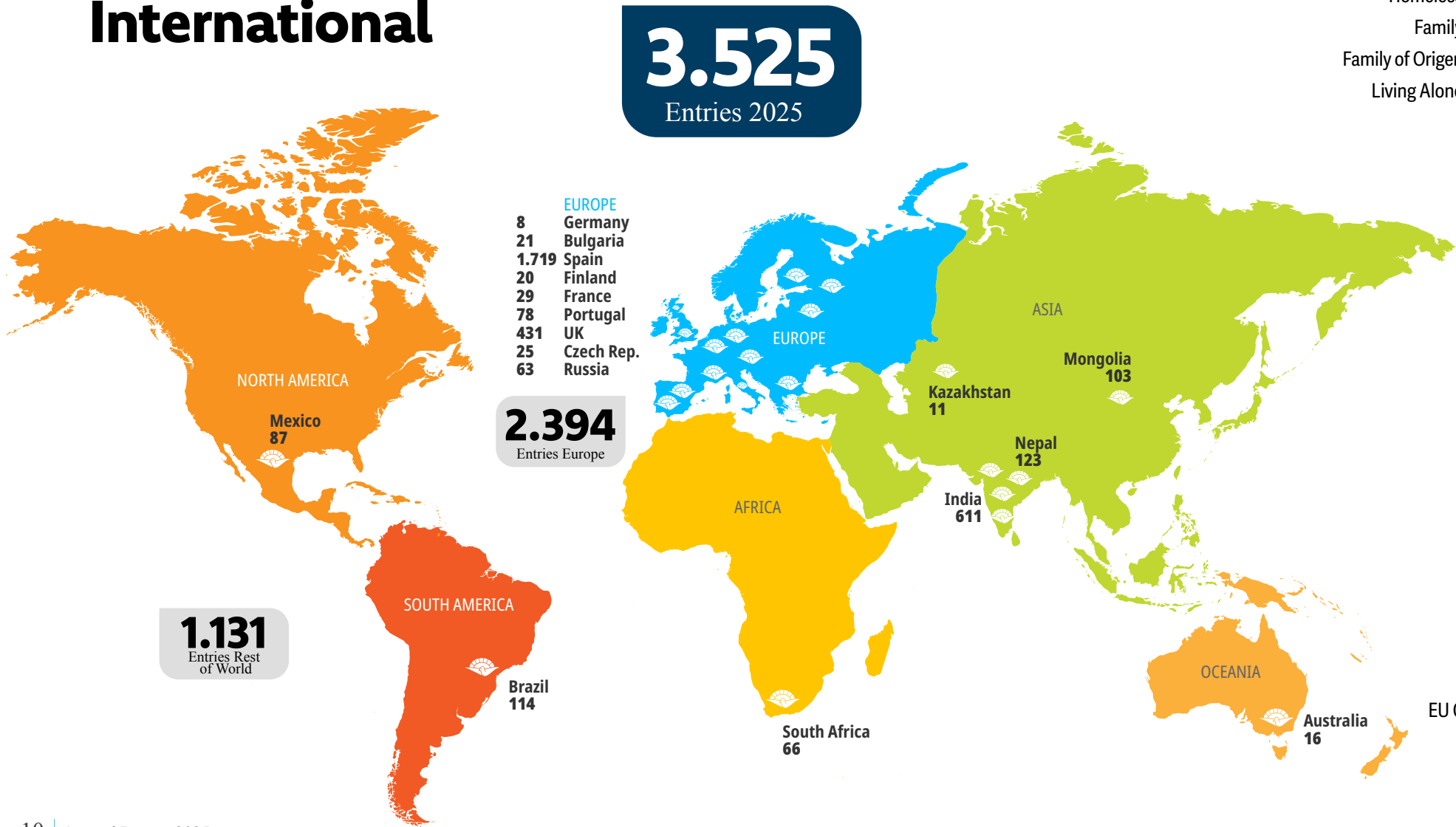


Profile of a Betel Resident

In 2025 we saw a significant increase in the number of homeless people entering Betel, rising from 5% in 2024 to 13% in 2025. In addition to the crisis of homelessness, which exacerbates social exclusion and marginalization, we see serious health issues, with substance abuse remaining as the primary reason for admission in over 80% of cases; **cocaine dependence** accounts for 35% of these cases, and **alcoholism** for 25%.

Visiting inmates

In 2025 Betel expanded it’s prison ministry to include a new correctional facility: Madrid VII Estremera. Moreover, new outreach activities were organized for inmates such as Flamenco and Rap concerts, Christmas plays, testimonials, guitar workshops, basketball games, and more. In 2025, Betel sponsored 18 parole requests in which inmates stayed at Betel houses.

Betel Houses

A Place to Call Home

Betel's houses are a free residential resource designed to provide a safe place to live for vulnerable individuals who struggle with addiction, lack a support network or stable housing.

The facilities are community based non-medical residences that operate in coordination with public and private healthcare and social services, ensuring a comprehensive approach that adapts to each person's needs.

Mehodology

Betel's program is based on a model of structured community living and peer support, with an approximate duration of 12 to 18 months. During their stay, residents engage in community life and participate in productive and socio-educational activities as part of their rehabilitation and process of personal recovery.

Betel Houses

The network of Betel's communities include facilities for men, women, and a specific shelter for women with children in vulnerable situations.

Objectives

The goal of this program is to see lives restored through a process of personal recovery that enables residents to improve their quality of life and move toward social integration.

Specific objectives include:

- 】 Providing a safe, structured, and stable environment.
- 】 Helping residents overcome addiction and social exclusion.
- 】 Promoting the values of responsibility, independence, and cooperation.
- 】 Developing individualized intervention programs.
- 】 Preventing violent situations and addressing the symptoms associated with exclusion.
- 】 Encouraging participation in social, educational, training, and vocational activities.

Eligibility Requirements

Access to Betel is voluntary and is intended for individuals over the age of 18 who possess basic independence in daily living, are open to professional support, and respect the rules of community living. A preliminary interview will help determine whether the program is a good fit for the person looking to come in.

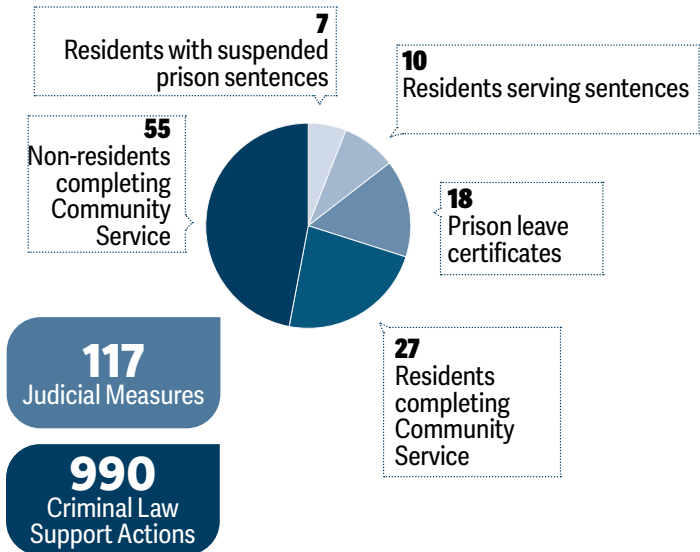

In 2025, 990 legal and criminal support actions were carried out. Betel provides opportunities for alternative sentences to incarceration in Betel residences, as well as Community Service options. Betel also provides support for short stays out of prison for those inmates preparing for release.

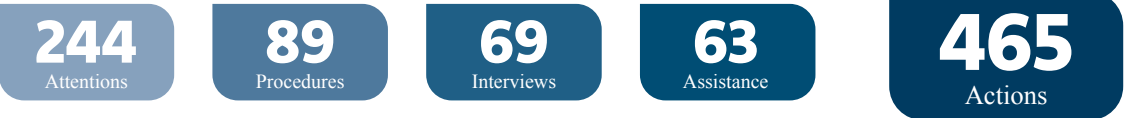
Social Assistance

Information and Orientation

Since 2018, Betel has been offering personalized support to individuals in vulnerable situations through our Social Information and Orientation Service. The service is available to Betel residents, individuals and families receiving food assistance, as well as anyone seeking support or information regarding social services and other available resources.

- Individualized social services, adapting each request to the available public and private resources.

Leadership and Social Volunteering Course

The goal of our Leadership and Social Volunteering Course is to offer useful tools that enable our residents and volunteers to provide effective, high-quality support in our communities as advocates for recovery within an environment of peer support and companionship. Being an agent of change involves gaining confidence in oneself while also empowering others to discover their inner

strength. Through the support of peers, individuals can learn to harness their own strengths, enabling them to become influential in their environments. To this end, from September to December, the 2025 annual training course was held in its XXVII edition, with a total of 20 students receiving a diploma of attendance.

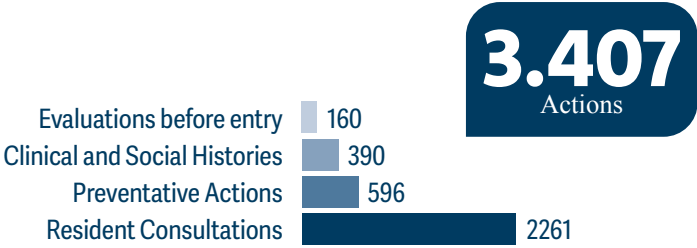
Betel residents have access medical services, provided by our own professional staff as well as through the public healthcare system.

A Vocation for Helping Others

Betel's Dental Clinic has been operating in Madrid since 2008, providing dental care to people with limited financial resources.

We started with a single office, but growing demand led us to gradually expand our facilities and services. Over the years, we have grown to the point where we now have four dental units operating at full capacity, offering high-quality care with a team of experienced professionals dedicated to serving our patients.

A Place to Start Over

Celebrating 40 years of Betel

Betel was born in 1985

Betel began in the streets of San Blas, Madrid. What started out as an act of kindness toward a young man struggling with addiction now supports thousands of people on their journey toward a new life.

A Safe Place to Start Over

In the 1980s, missionaries Elliott and Mary Tepper and Lindsay and Mykal McKenzie of WEC (Worldwide Evangelization for Christ) reached out to young people struggling with drug addiction. There they met Raul Casto, who needed a place to rebuild his life.

After overcoming his addiction, Raul decided to help others in the same situation. The first Betel homes were established, and today they are present in more than 100 cities across 18 countries. Each home is a place to start over.

Social Responsibility and Commitment

For 40 years, Betel has provided companionship, a sense of community, and support to those who need it most. In 2000, the Ministry of the Interior designated it a Public Benefit Association.

Betel is the social service arm of the Betel Church (AEMC) and carries out its work in coordination with public and private networks.

Celebrating 40 years

On October 24, 2025, Betel celebrated its 40th anniversary with a heartfelt ceremony, filled with gratitude toward its staff, donors, and volunteers.

The event brought together prominent figures from various fields, whose remarks highlighted the human impact of Betel:

Dr. Luis Buzon, a pioneer in the clinical care of patients with HIV/AIDS, he recalled how he treated the first residents at Ramon y Cajal Hospital, emphasizing the importance of providing knowledge, hope, and dignity.



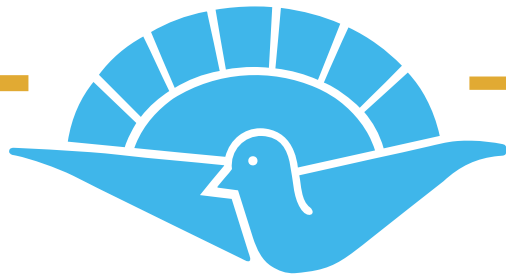

The most important thing we have been learning is how to serve and love people who are lost and in need, with God's help, through the Betel ministry. We are incredibly thankful that this priceless ministry is still in our nation, as well as for the support of the "Betel family" and leadership in the world.

From Spain to Finland and beyond

Mario and Lina

Mario

In April 1991, after 15 years in the world of drugs, I entered Betel.

I was introduced to drugs at age 16. After many ups and downs and several jobs, I ended up on the streets. My father died, and my mother had to take my house keys away because there wasn't much left for me to steal. My sister had already died from an overdose. After wandering the streets of Madrid for five years, getting to know the world of crime, and after a couple of attempts at rehabilitation, I arrived at Betel.

Six months after entering, I had an experience that helped me understand that God was all I needed. When the opportunity arose to start a Betel house in Germany, I volunteered. There I met my wife Lina, a missionary with Amistad from Xalapa, Mexico; we got married, and our son Josua was born.

After six years, we decided to leave Germany to go to Russia and start Betel there.

From Russia, we opened centers in four cities, as well as in Kazakhstan and Ukraine. After nine years, we had to leave Russia and decided to start Betel in the nearest country, Finland. Later we also started Betel in Estonia.

We have lived in Finland for over 18 years. Our son studied here and married a lovely Finnish woman.

Looking back, I can only say that God has always been with us.

Lina

I am Mexican; my parents always taught us to believe in God. As a young woman in college, I was deeply curious to get to know that God, then one day I felt called to missions.

I had heard about Betel when I first began my journey of faith in Jesus Christ, through a missionary who spoke about everything that was happening in the Betel community: people on the brink of despair coming to faith and rescuing thousands of people marginalized by drugs. That missionary was Armando Garcia.

Betel was already 10 years old when I arrived in Madrid on January 6, 1996, with a great desire to serve. It was the heyday of missions; God's perfect time to expand beyond Spain. And it was on the mission field, in Germany, where I met my husband Mario, and we've been together for 28 years.

Later we left for Russia, where we experienced very intense times and saw God's provision and response to our calling, as well as the fruit of our labor. For reasons beyond our control, we had to leave there and went to Finland.

After serving all these years, the summary of what we have learned is that mankind's need is the same everywhere: to be free and to know God.

The Adventure of Our Lives

Ivan and Encarni Adan

We arrived in Betel in 1989, very young and, at the same time, broken. Ivan was deep in drug addiction, and Encarni was carrying the “baggage” of a broken family and a chaotic life.

At first, our only goal was for Ivan to kick his habit so he could lead a “normal” life. We never imagined that God had very different plans for us; His ways are always higher than ours. Over time, we both felt that the true purpose of our existence was to serve Jesus, being His feet and His hands on earth. So, we decided to stay at Betel to help others find the same hope that we had received.

Over the course of these 37 years, we have lived the greatest adventure of our lives. A journey that has taken us across three continents, blessed us with three wonderful children who fill us with pride, and given us a global family that has always stood by our side.

For the past 20 years, we have lived and served in Asia, where we’ve had the privilege of witnessing God’s power: restoring lives, healing wounds, and restoring hope to people whom society had already given up on. One example of this is the more than 40 children rescued from a childhood of abuse and deprivation; today they have a new life, many of them pursuing a college education and, above all, a bright future ahead.

Certainly, it has not been an easy journey. There have been battles, opposition, moments of discouragement, illness, and the sadness of seeing those who decide to give up without giving God a chance, walk away. However, the overall outcome is positive. Despite the challenges, we can make the prophet Samuel’s declaration our own: “Thus far the Lord has helped us.”

Called to the Mission Field

Raul and Meike Reyes

One day at Bible school, God made a profound impact on my life regarding missions when I heard the teacher say, “If you want to bless your country, go!” It was a shock to me, since I loved Mexico, but God revealed to me that “it is more blessed to give than to receive,” and that if my nation gave me to bless other nations, my family to bless other families, and my congregation to bless other congregations, my country, my family, and my congregation would be doubly blessed.

And so at the age of 22 in 1990, I was sent by the Amistad Church in Puebla, Mexico, to Betel in Spain, where I stayed for five years, helping, living, and spending time with the young people in rehabilitation.

I don’t have the words to describe what God taught me and what He did during that entire time. It was amazing to see how the young people surrendered their lives to God and how their lives were radically changed, and soon they began going out as missionaries to other countries.

Meanwhile, in Germany, Meike received a letter from a German friend who had been with us in Spain, in which he wrote: “Meike, here in Betel, the Book of Acts is being lived out in real life and in full color! God is restoring drug addicts, and they are finding a new life!” So she traveled to Spain to visit Betel. We met there, and then she decided to go to Mexico to study at the Amistad Bible Institute in Puebla.

In 1995, I was sent with a team to Germany to open a new Betel center; that same year, Meike returned from Mexico and joined us to help with the new ministry!

We were married in 1997, and together we have served the Lord for over 30 years; we have seen God’s hand at work continuously. Alongside us, the young men and women and the team that God has raised up are the ones who have made this ministry possible in Germany!

We give thanks to the Lord, because His faithfulness has surpassed anything we could have imagined!

And now the next step is the nation of Israel! May God bless you, Raul and Meike.

A Value to Society

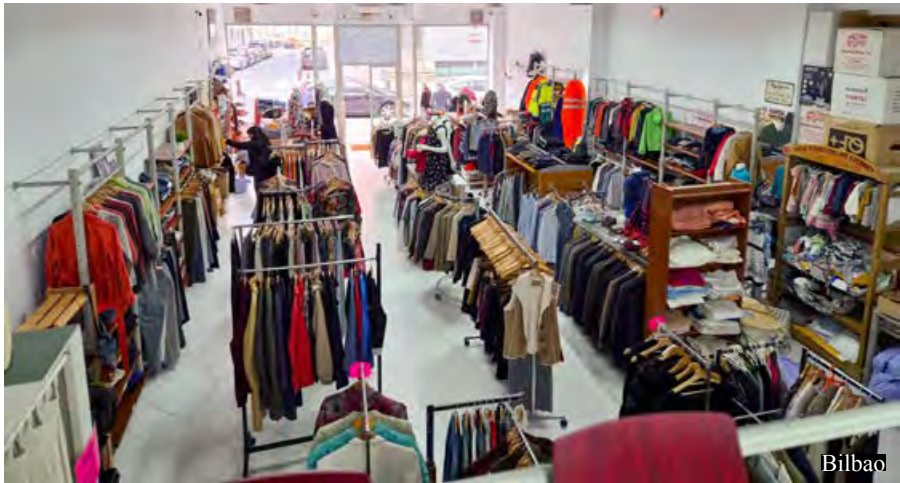

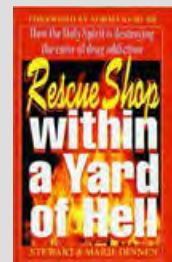
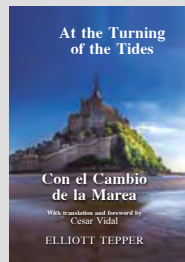
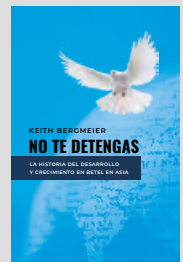
Since 2022, Betel has launched a training program at our headquarters in Madrid: a language school that offers dynamic English classes to small groups, both in-person and online, including specific courses for the preparation of official exams, primarily those from Cambridge University, or to improve language proficiency. Located one kilometer south of Ciudad Real is the Betania Retreat Center, an ideal venue for retreats, camps, and conferences, set in a rustic, family-friendly environment. It features 28 rooms for couples with children, as well as 300 individual beds. It also features a campground with restrooms and showers and a large multipurpose summer auditorium that seats 3,000 people. There are also swimming pools, sports areas, and a playground. The dining service offers regional dishes and can accommodate up to 350 guests.

The experience also allows interns to witness the process of recovery firsthand, as they see the transformation of residents in the Betel houses.

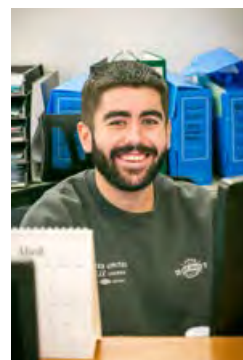

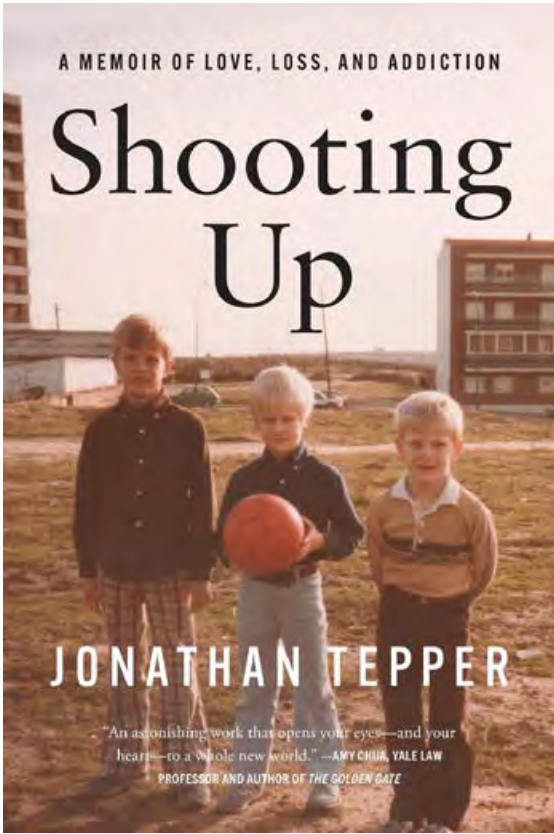

Jonathan Tepper’s Memoir tells the Story of Betel

‘Shooting Up’

In the shadows of Madrid’s San Blas neighborhood, an American missionary family puts down roots among heroin addicts and builds an unlikely church. Shooting Up is Jonathan Tepper’s searing memoir of a childhood spent in San Blas, where syringes littered playgrounds and his closest friends were recovering junkies twice his age.

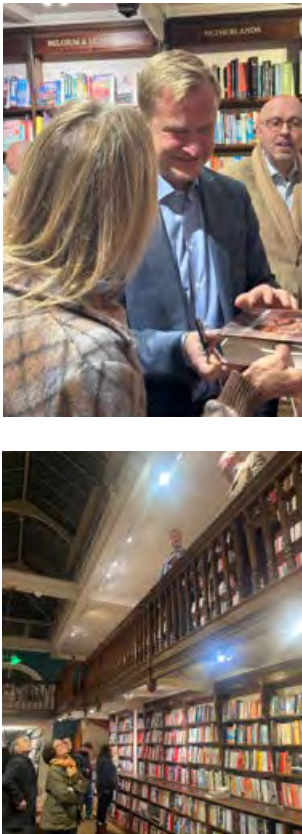
When Elliott and Mary Tepper arrive in 1985 with their four young sons, San Blas is ground zero of Europe’s heroin epidemic. While other children play soccer, Jonathan befriends bank robbers and former prostitutes. His heroes aren’t athletes but men like Raul and Jambri, charismatic ex-addicts who transform their lives through the revolutionary drug rehabilitation center the Teppers help found.

What begins as eight men in an apartment becomes Betel, now one of the world’s largest drug rehabilitation net-

works. But this isn’t a story of institutional triumph. It’s an intimate portrait of radical compassion amid the AIDS crisis, told through the eyes of a boy watching his parents choose the damned over the respectable, witnessing miracles and tragedies in equal measure.

Tepper writes with unflinching honesty about the magnetic pull of the streets, the seductive danger of heroin, and the complicated love between broken people healing together. His prose, elegant yet raw, captures both the squalor of addiction and the stubborn persistence of grace.

This is a memoir about choosing to see beauty in ruins, finding family among outcasts, and learning that the answer to suffering is always more love. It is a story of love and loss, but it is also a love letter to friends, family, and even to learning.

Growth in Brazil

On October 12, 2025, the team consisting of Claudio, Odair, Edgar, and Flavio arrived in Rio de Janeiro to open a new Betel community.

During the first two months, no men came in. Far from being a waste of time, this was a crucial phase for establishing the project: strengthening ties with local churches and beginning various initiatives. By the second month, the center had already become financially self-sufficient. Starting in the third month, men began arriving, with the number reaching eleven.

In December, a very important step was taken with the purchase of plot of land for the future Betel home in Rio de Janeiro.

Winning Documentary about Betel in the United Kingdom

Nominated at the Cannes World Film Festival

“21st Century Monastery” Duration: 75 minutes

Four years ago, a British filmmaker and her husband, supportive donors to Betel UK, were introduced to the charity through the transformed life of their work colleague’s son. Impressed with what they saw and experienced at our Nottingham and Birmingham centres, she inquired whether we would permit her to produce a full-length documentary about the work of Betel UK. Our team agreed, and the filming lasted more than 2 years. The film crew followed the stories of two lives. They chose to profile heroin-addicted Adrian from day three of his entering Betel Birmingham, all the way to his court sentencing for seri-

ous drug charges 20 months later. They also followed Nikki, whose cocaine and alcohol addiction led to seven miscarriages, one still-born child, and a daughter named Hope. The film introduces us to Betel leaders and recovery practices as Nikki attempts to regain custody of Hope from her legal guardians, Nikki’s parents.

In Spring 2025, 21st Century Monastery was nominated among four finalists for Best Feature Documentary at the Cannes World Film Festival. Since then, it has won three awards at additional festivals, and has been officially selected or nominated at seven others.
